Brownfields in Canada: Setting Plans for the Future

We'll begin the session by presenting an analysis of the results of



the joint CBN/Ryerson University survey on the state of brownfields in 2018 compared with where we were in 2003. What progress has been made? What issues still remain? What new ones have evolved? What solutions have been suggested? To aid in understanding the survey results and possible future directions, we'll also have a presentation from a Ryerson University planning studio group on brownfields policy across the country. This will set the stage for the breakout groups.



In breakout groups, Conference participants will work with facilitators to discuss key areas identified through the survey:

- Federal government involvement in brownfields
- Provincial government involvement in brownfields
- Municipal government involvement in brownfields
- Brownfield inventories
- Brownfields and linkages to other societal issues
- Brownfields and innovation



When you visit the on-site registration desk to pick up your name badge, you'll be asked to register for the group of your choice. To ensure the group discussions achieve their outcomes, each group will be limited to 25 participants.

Each group will, through answering specific questions, develop one or more recommendations they'll bring to a plenary session. The plenary, facilitated by Todd Latham, will agree on specific steps to move Canada's brownfield agenda forward.

This is your opportunity to set the course for brownfield reuse as the preferred development alternative and determine the actions we can take to promote that, so be sure to register [today](#).
